Note from the Pastor: "More Than Leaves Will Blow Into Our Yard"

In Michael Lindvall's book, *The Good News from North Haven*, people are not always so good. One of the stories, for example, depicts Alvina Johnson, who is so incensed that her neighbor's leaves fall over her property line that she takes the time and the initiative to hire "Danny Olson to go up in my tree and mark the leaves. He put an X on each one with a Magic Marker..." And this, according to the main character, is only fair. *She* should only be responsible for raking and bagging the leaves that grow vibrant and green—only to then fade and fall— in her own yard. Get the picture?

I mention this scenario as we enter the month of October because the winds of change are in the air—AND— because taking responsibility in the midst of change is tricky business. Here at Northwood Presbyterian Church, of course, we're not just talking about leaves, but the on-going ministry and mission that we have the privilege to enjoy. And through the years, it's clear that many of you (reading these words) have taken vital responsibility for doing all kinds of things. From decorating the sanctuary to leading Bible Study... from singing in the choir to baking bread and cookies... from gardening in the garden to budgeting in the budget... responsibilities abound, and you have met them.

However, as of this time of transition—these 'interim' months (when Northwood is between permanently-installed pastors)—it may be prudent to imagine the other so-called 'leaves' that may be blowing into our sphere of influence. In other words, every Christian congregation on the face of the earth exists for the benefit of its non-members, its stray sheep, its curious and not-so-curious outsiders. Consider what Jesus says to a fig tree—yes, a tree with leaves (but no fruit) in Mark 11:13:

"Seeing in the distance a fig tree in leaf, he went to see whether perhaps he would find anything on it. When he came to it, he found nothing but leaves, for it was not the season for figs. He said to it, 'May no one ever eat fruit from you again.'"

Now, is this just what the Incarnation of God sounds like when he's in a bad mood and hungry? Or does it suggest something about taking responsibility in times of great transition? In search of a reply, I also come to this passage from Luke 13:6—9, in which Jesus tells this parable:

"A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. So he said to the gardener, 'See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting soil?' He replied, 'Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down."

And so, what do you think? What do you feel? What do you believe? What do you do?

My sense is that all of us here at Northwood—myself included—have about a year or so to dig around. Moreover, there's probably going to be some 'manure' that's spread around our Christian roots in the forms of grief and anxiety and doubt. For my part as your interim pastor, I'm

committing myself to care for you, to love you, to pray for you... but also to ask some provocative questions about the responsibilities that God's Spirit has invited us to pursue. And many of these, you see, may resemble the colorful, but decaying leaves that have been caught up in a breeze and have fluttered in our direction.

Thanks be to God! Some will be yellow. Others, orange, red, brown and black...
