Becoming A Member Is To Re-Member

"These things I remember, as I pour out my soul: how I went with the throng, and led them in procession to the house of God, with glad shouts and songs of thanksgiving, a multitude keeping festival."

—Psalm 42:4

"On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and those members of the body that we think less honorable we clothe with greater honor, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect; whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honor to the inferior member, that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it."

—1 Corinthians 12:22—26

I've been pondering the number of people in this congregation who seem to *belong* to it, but who have said they're "not members." And that, to my mind, is a shame. Membership at Northwood Presbyterian Church happens to be a vital tool in developing the integrity and the intimacy of our relationships. In Christ, we're not merely friends, with common interests and cultural sensibilities; we're covenant partners, who are being trained for the Kingdom of God. Consequently, if one of us says "I love Jesus" but "I'm not a member with you in the Body of Christ," I wonder what that means for the seriousness and the strength of a mature faith.

On the other hand, I get the idea that membership in a church seems like a mere formality, and that when life and death are on the line, we shouldn't be bothered with mere formalities. And I get the fact that many show up (frequently or infrequently) because "that's how my family raised me." But then again, sometimes a formal commitment in public, with words and with water, before God, takes us to a more transcendent level of intimacy.

During this upcoming Season of Advent—as we anticipate the God who joins us in the flesh—I'm inviting you to consider your status as a member who re-members the Body of Christ.


December Fun Friday & Wassail Cookies
